



Community Center Lectures Higashiyama Snowshoe "Walking on Mt.Taroyama"

On February 6, the Higashiyama Snowshoeing "Walking on Mt. Taroyama" was held at the community center.

The 8km walk took participants from the former Yanaba ski resort to the Mikkaichiba area via the Wachiba Pass and Mt.Taroyama. While stepping on fresh snow that had fallen the day before, participants discovered animal tracks, listened to an explanation of the characteristics of trees and the history of the area, and deepened their learning.

Activities Reports at Noto Peninsula Earthquake

On January 26, two Water and Sewerage Division officials were dispatched to Nanao City, Ishikawa Prefecture, to provide water trucks and water supply support in accordance with a request for service under the Japan Water Works Association Chubu Regional Branch's agreement on mutual support in the event of a disaster.









From February 12 to 17, one official from the Water and Sewerage Division was dispatched to Wajima City, Ishikawa Prefecture, as a member of "Team Nagano," a joint Nagano Prefecture disaster support team, along with officials from other municipalities in the Ohoku region, to assist in the operation of evacuation shelters.

For three days from February 20, one person from the Resident Division was dispatched to Shika Town, Hakui County, Ishikawa Prefecture, to provide disaster support for the Noto Peninsula earthquake. He was mainly in charge of disaster waste disposal operations, including demolition at public expense.

- Metals that are contaminated with non-metallic composite materials, such as small appliances, will be charged if there is
 a reduction in the purchase price.
- For items other than those listed below, charges for the same or similar goods apply.
- The prices above are for one piece, one unit, one bottle and one pair.
- If the waste is not separated by type at the time of delivery, it will be charged as mixed waste.
- Small household appliances (small appliances that use electricity or batteries) are collected free of charge at the Hakuba Recycle Centre.

Agriculture and Forestry in Hakuba Village

Utilization of Wood Biomass and Oak Waste

Hakuba Village promotes the utilization of wood biomass (a sustainable organic resource originated from wood) by supplying wood waste and properly disposed dead oak trees to villagers for local energy production. In recent years, a large outbreak of oak withers has occurred here in Hakuba Village, and many oak trees have died. Oak wither is a tree disease that occurs periodically in the natural cycle and is said to have been around since the Edo period. This year, we made mouse pads out of oak withers-damaged wood for the purpose of making people aware of local timber.

<u>Project for the Mousepads Making of Oak</u> Withered Wood

In cooperation with the Nagano Prefectural Forestry Division, the project created mousepads and distributed them to related organizations in order to make use of oak withered trees. When creating the Oak withers mousepads, we artificially dry the wood so that all the insects have been killed, including the inside of the wood. No chemicals are used, so it can be used safely.





2024 Spring Wildfire Prevention Campaign

From March 1 to May 31, is the campaign for spring wildfire prevention. Due to the recent dry weather and strong winds, there is a risk of wildfires in the forests. Please take the following measures to prevent forest fires from outbreak:

- (1) Do not start fires in fire-prone areas where there is dead grass or other obstacles.
- (2) Do not leave the area while a fire is being built, and make sure to extinguish the fire completely after use.
- (3) Do not make a bonfire or light a fire during strong winds.
- (4) When setting up a fire, be sure to obtain permission from the village mayor and install the necessary fire prevention equipment in advance.
- (5) Only smoke cigarettes in designated areas, always extinguish cigarette butts, and do not throw them away.
- (6) Do not play with fire and do not allow others to do so.

Registering a dog in Japan

Dog owners must register their dogs within 30 days of acquiring. Registration allows the municipality to contact the owner about any issues e.q. lost dogs or accidents. Registration is valid for life.

While walking your dog, remember to follow basic dog walking etiquette:

- Always keep your dog on a lead in public places
- Remember to pick up after your dog and dispose of the waste correctly
