## 特産品【 TOKUSANHIN 】

 Tokusanhin are local products which produced or harvested in a particular area, and are considered to be representative of the area and its local culture and lifestyle.
 Some of Hakuba Village's specialties are introduced below.

# MURASAKI MAI むらさきまい -Purple Black Rice-



The murasaki mai, purple-black rice, it is the glutinous rice can be found in the kodaimai(acient rice) section.

As for the TANADA-terraced paddy field- in Aoni Hakuba Village which was selected as one of the Top100 terraced paddy field in japan, by the ministry of agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries.

The 100 best includes rice fields which look very like Tanada,



being located on a slope steeper than one twentieth. If you grow purple-black rice and write rice together, they will cross-pollinate. And the write rice will become a minor grain. For this reason, ancient rice needs to be grown in isolated areas, and the Aoni area was chosen as the best place to grow it.





## GOLDEN BERRY - Hozuki ほおずき【鬼灯】-

Production began in 2013, led by women's groups in the village, with the aim of creating a new specialty product. Currently, two groups are producing the product in the Mikkaichiba and Oide districts.

There are two types of cherries; "orange cherries" and "Taiyo-no-Ko". Orange cherries are characterized by their large size and juiciness. They have a very good balance of sourness and sweetness, and have a fresh aroma like their name. Taiyo-no-ko has a higher sugar content, is smaller and greener in color than the Orange Cherry, and is characterized by its full-bodied sweetness.

## Blueberry ブルーベリー

As a pioneer of blueberry cultivation and tourism farms in the Taihoku region, Hakuba Blueberry Garden opened in 1984 as a farmland utilization measure for infrastructure development in the limori district. With a history of about 40 years, it became an originator of Hakuba's specialty products. When it first opened, it was operated by a local organization. Currently, an agricultural corporation in the village has taken over the management of the garden, which is now popular among many customers/tourist.



There are 9 varieties (about 2,500 trees) are grown in 1 hectare farm, which has acquired "Organic JAS Certification.





### Black Beans -Kuromame 黒豆-

The HakubaCho district began planting black beans in 2021, with the producer's desire to create a new specialty for Hakuba Village. "Soybean Project, which have been organized planting and harvesting activities by local high School students and Kita Elementary School. Their products sells at Michi no Eki.

As you may know, Japanese Health Insurance Tax is based on your income of previous year in Japan. The NHI Tax is calculated as shown below. In addition, Nursing care portion applies to NHI members between 40 and 64-year-old; Support to latter stage elderly portion is a fund established in FY 2008 to support the Latter–stage elderly medical care system, which is levied on all NHI members who are under 75-year-old.

If the total annual income of the previous year of all NHI members in a household is lower than the reference standards as shown below, per-capita portion and household portion may be reduced. Please note that the reduction will not be approved if the total annual income cannot be confirmed.

# **Reduction for Children**

In order to reduce the economic burden on households raising children, 50% of per-capita portion on \*children under six years old in all households enrolled in the NHI program will be reduced from April2022. \*Children who born after April 2<sup>nd</sup>,2017 If total annual income of the previous year of all NHI members in a household is lower than the reference standards and per-capita portion and household portion is reduced, 50% of the basic reduction rate will be added to the reduced rate after adaptation.

### [Note]

Total annual household income includes different kinds of income such as forestry income and capital gains (before special deduction) of all NHI members in the household. In addition, the income of householder will be taken into account for judging a tax reduction, even if the householder is not an NHI member. In other words, the Total annual household income does not equal the amount shown on the Taxable income notification and so forth.

XIf you have been receiving the benefit of special reduction for family workers, it will also be taken into account for the judgment of the NHI Tax reduction.

- ◆The NHI tax reduction qualification may be extended for the remaining NHI members of a household for a certain period, even if a member of the same household has withdrawn from NHI and subscribed latter-stage elderly medical care system. The reduction rates are different according to the household structure. Please consult the Resident Division if you consider yourself qualified.
- ◆A dependent (age 65 or above), who becomes an NHI member because of the supporter has withdrawn from Employee's health insurance and subscribes Latter-stage elderly medical care system, may be qualified for a tax reduction. Please contact the Resident Division if you consider yourself qualified.
- ◆A reduction system is available for those who lost their jobs because of being fired bankruptcy or restructuring of the company.

# Subsidies and Grants Information

# Subsidy for rechargeable grass cutters, etc.

As part of the "Zero Carbon City" declaration, subsidies will be provided for farmers/villagers to purchase rechargeable grass cutters, etc.

### **Targets**

Those who own or lease farmland in Hakuba village.

### Eliqible expenses

Within 1/2 of the purchase cost (up to 20,000 yen, rounded down to the nearest 1,000 yen).

Eligible rechargeable grass cutters, etc.

Agricultural machinery such as grass cutters, chainsaws, blowers, augers, hedge trimmers, sprayers, cultivators, etc.

[Note]Only rechargeable machines are applicable.

\*Machines purchased before the grant approval will not be applicable for the subsidy.

# Appearance care for people with cancer

— Helping you feel like yourself and live your life

With the early detection of cancer and advances in medical treatment, many people continue working while undergoing cancer treatment. On the other hand, changes in appearance associated with cancer treatment, such as scars from surgery, hair loss, and loss of breasts, can be distressing for cancer patients.

Appearance care is a medical, cosmetic, and psychic support to complement changes in appearance to alleviate the distress of cancer patients.

### Prosthetic devices that are eligible for subsidies;

(1) Head prosthetic

Wigs, nets for wearing, hats with hair

(2) Breast prosthetics

Breast prosthetic pads, prosthetic underwear, special bathing gowns, and artificial breasts \*Breast reconstruction surgery is not covered.

(3) Others

Epithets (artificial prostheses to supplement missing parts such as fingers or nose due to surgery associated with cancer treatment, etc.) \*Artificial breasts are included in breast correction devices.

### **Grant recipients**

The following requirements are eligible for the subsidy.

- -Those who have an address in the village \*Age and gender are not required.
- -Those who have been diagnosed with cancer and have undergone or are currently undergoing cancer treatment (surgery, drug treatment, radiation therapy, etc.)
- Those who have purchased the eliqible prosthetic devices on or after April 1, 2023.

## Number of subsidies and amount

(1) Number of subsidies

Head prosthetics: 1 time

Breast prosthetics: Once each for left and right tassels other: 1 time

(2) Subsidy amount

1/2 of the purchase cost (up to 20,000 yen) for each prosthetics, etc.
