
About the Solar Panels

Proper Plastic Sorting Supports Recycling and Village Funding

Improper Items Fund in Plastic Waste Collection — A call for Correct Sorting







In Hakuba Village, collected plastic is recycled into raw materials. Before recycling, the collected plastics must be compressed into 1 m³ blocks called bales. These bales are inspected twice a year to check for dirt and foreign objects. During those inspections, the level of contamination and the presence of foreign materials are closely examined. Based on the results, bales with minimal dirt and low contamination are recognized for their contribution to reducing recycling costs. As a result, the village may receive a distribution from the *Recycling Rationalization Contribution Fund*, which supports the village's budget. However, if the quality is found to be poor, there is a risk that the village may not be allowed to deliver plastic waste for recycling in the following year.



We kindly ask all residents to continue proper sorting and cleaning of plastic waste to help ensure sustainable recycling efforts and to support Hakuba Village's environmental and financial well-being.

Local authorities have found several incorrect items mixed in with plastic containers and packaging waste. To help with proper recycling and safe processing, please follow these guidelines:

Dirty plastic containers

→ If the dirt doesn't come off after washing, put them in **burnable garbage**.

PET bottles

→ **Remove caps and labels**, wash and dry them, and sort as **PET bottle recyclables**.

Plastic items over 50cm

- → These must be **cut to under 50cm** to avoid machinery issues.
- → **String-like items** (e.g. PP bands) should also be **cut**, not tied.
- Other materials (paper, sticks, desiccants, etc.)
 - → Do not mix with plastic**. Sort each material correctly.

Please Do Not Include the Following Items Under Any Circumstances!

Dangerous Items such as razors or glass
 Those pose serious risks to the works involved in the recycling process.

Items with a risk of ignition, such as lithium-ion batteries
 Those may cause fires. In the event of a fire, it could lead to severe damage to collection vehicles or recycling facilities.

Preschool Orientation

Date: September 30th (Tue) Starts at 10:00 Venue: Fureai Center 2nd floor

- Children under the age of 3 must reapply each year. If you plan to continue using the service after April 2026, please be sure to submit a new application during the designated application period.
- Attendance at the orientation does not affect the admission screening process. However, all application forms must be submitted within the application period. Applications submitted after the deadline will be given lower priority for admission.



Hakuba Village will hold an orientation for families interested in shirouma Preschool, Familia Hakuba and Sunrise Kids. While the session will include a brief overview of Shingakukai Hakuba Kindergarten, those wishing to enroll their child in the kindergarten are kindly asked to attend a separate orientation hosted by kindergarten itself.

Application for admission

Submission: Child Raising Division, Fureai Center, 3rd floor October 16(Thu) – October 31(Fri), *weekdays only Hours: 8:30 –12:00/13:00 –17:15

*Please apply during the above period even if you are planning to enroll your child in the middle of the 2025 fiscal year. (e.g, for enrollment starting July 1st, 2025, etc.)

Children Eligible for Enrollment

Children from the first day of the month following their 6-month birthday up to children who have not yet entered elementary school.

Required Documents

- (1) Application Form
- (2) Proof that the applicant is unable to care for the child (e.g., employment certificate, medical certificate, etc.) Only required for those applying for childcare services.
- (3) My Number Consent Form Application documents will be distributed at orientation. If you are unable to attend, the documents will be available at Child Raising Division after the orientation.

Oak Wilt Resurfaces in Hakuba Village



Hakuba Village is facing a resurgence of oak wilt(ナラ枯れ-Nara Gare), first outbreak in 2009 and returning in 2020. This summer's heatwave has triggered new infections, especially near Iwatake, including Dunguri, and the "Fureai no Mori" public facility.

To ensure public safety, dangerous oak trees were felled on August 2nd -5th, while some were preserved using trunk-injection treatment.

The village is also repurposing affected timber for firewood, benches, and school gifts, promoting both safety and sustainability.



Hakuba Village will continue creating products from local timber and plans to collaborate with private businesses to offer them as hometown tax return gifts. Residents are encouraged to share ideas for new products with the village's agriculture Division.
