Preventing the spread of COVID-19

I urge you to care about human rights. Each one of us should think about and work on prevention.

To all those involved in Hakuba Village (For the villagers and related parties to Hakuba village)

I am Mayer of Hakuba Village, Masatake Shimokawa. The third wave of COVID-19 spread is raging. COVID-19 can infect anyone, even if you are careful. You are no exception. First of all, I wish the infected people a speedy recovery and ask each of you to once again confirm and thoroughly implement measures to prevent the spread of infection.

Again, I ask you to prevent the spread of infection.

- 1. Be sure to follow the "New Normal" Shinshu Edition.
- 2. Be very careful about visiting areas with high incidences of positive people.
- 3. If you have symptoms such as a fever and other concerns, call a public health center immediately.
- 4. Please take thorough measures at your office.

Think again

In Nagano Prefecture, there are five things of "we want you to think right now" as follows.

- 1. Lately, have you been getting closer to people, thinking that this is as good as it gets?
- 2. Do you often forget to disinfect and wash your hands inadvertently?
- 3. Do you think that if you're well, you won't be contagious to others?
- 4. Do you think that if you wear a mask, you don't need ventilation and humidification?
- 5. Do you think you're okay and that person is okay?

To save lives, we all need to do more to work together to stop the spread of infection. Therefore, let's think again about the future of infection prevention.

Preventing the Spread of Infection During the Year-end and **New Year**

The end of another year is upon us. During the year-end and New Year's holidays, there will be more opportunities to drink and eat as people return home and ravel, as well as New Year's Eve and New New Year's parties. This increases the risk of infection spread. Based on previous incidents of positivity, we ask that you take action to refrain from high-risk situations and activities.

Let's live through this corona disaster with the community unit that was once called the Miracle of Hakuba Village.

Let's spend the year-end and New Year's holidays peacefully.

Every one of you is vital to protecting your lives and health. Basic infection prevention measures (social distance, wearing masks,

thorough hand washing and disinfection)

- Carefully consider visiting areas where infection is spreading.
 Please consult with your family about returning home well in advance.
- Do a health check for about two weeks beforehand, and if you are not feeling well, do not return home or travel!
- If you have cold symptoms, refrain from going out and call your family doctor, consultation center, or health center for advice.

- Do not participate if you are not feeling well.
- Please disinfect your hands before and after dinner.
- Do not come into direct or indirect contact with others.
- Wear a mask to avoid airborne droplets.
- · Ventilate frequently

This is an message from governor of a prefecture Dec, 25, 2020

The year-end New Year holidays will soon be upon us. This is an important time of the year when family members, relatives, and friends who live far away from each other and are not normally above to get together and deepen their friendship.

However, we are currently in the midst of the third wave of COVID-19.

Although the infection situation in Nagano Prefecture has calmed down compared to the past due to the efforts of everyone to prevent infection and the strengthening of countermeasures by Nagano Prefecture and municipalities, if the infection spreads and the number of hospitalized patients increases in the future, it could have a serious impact on the healthcare service system.

In addition, there are three concerns for the up coming year-end and New Year holidays.

- 1. Increased opportunities, for having dinners, tea-talking, etc. with people who are close to you but not usually with you.
- 2. Increase in traffic to and from the Tokyo metropolitan area,
- 3. During the year-end and New Year's holidays, the healthcare service system will be not intensive nursing care. In order to maintain medical care and protect everyone's life and health, further increases must be avoided at all costs.

Nagano Prefecture will do its best to reduce the burden on medical institutions by having more overnight care facilities, but what we need is the power of each of you.

In order to overcome the third wave of the COVID-19 and to have a healthy New Year, I would like to ask you all again for the following points.



New Coronavirus Infection (COVID-19)] Message from the Governor on the occasion of the year-end and New Year holidays

This is message is based on the current infection situation, and additional messages may be issued in the future if the spread of the infection progresses further.

Snow Shoveling

The village office requires your cooperation.

For everyone's benefit, please consider and cooperate the snowplow operates smoothlly.

1. No on-street parking

Snow removal operations are usually conducted at night or from early in the morning. Please help us by not parking on the streets or public areas to ensure a smooth process.

2. Do not plough snow onto roads

Be considerate, do not plough or depoist of snow on public roads or sidewalks. This action may put pedestrians and motorists at risk and may lead to fatal traffice accidents. The person whose action caused the accident has to take full responsibility.

3. Put up signs to raise awareness about falling snow from roof

Falling snow and ice from the roof can cause severe injuries to pedestrians. Please clear off roof snow of your property before it becomes dangerous. Also, you should put up signs at where snow may fall off.

The property owner is responsible for clearing the snow that falls from your roof onto a public pavement promptly.

4. Cut off of trees that may interfere with snow ploughing operations

Keep your trees trimmed. Also, branches or trees which interfere with snow ploughing operations may be cut off.

5. Do not remove snow poles

The bamboo poles stood up along the roads are for a smooth and safe snow removal operation. Please do not remove any poles.

6. About spreading of road de-ice

The road de-ice is usually spread twice a day: before the peak-hour to go and from work or school in the morning and evening.

7. About snow removal in private areas

Avoid or minimize the troubles you may cause your neighbours when removing snow from your private areas. Do not plough or deposit of snow onto somebody's land without the ower's permission.

Addition to that, residents who live adjacent to a public road or a

pavement should take up the responsibility to clear up the snow remains in front of your entrance or parking lots.

8. About snow disposal sites

It is very important to have enough snow disposal sites to ensure snow removal operations can be carried out smoothly. We ask for the land owner's understanding and cooperation in this matter.

9. Skiing or snowboarding on roads is strictly forbidden

Sking or snowboarding on roads interferes with snow poughing operation. Also, it puts you, other pedestrians and motorist at risk and thus it is prohibited.
