The bridge repair work on Prefectural Road No. 33 will be closed to vehicles.



Subsidy for Dog/Cat Birth Control

Amount of Subsidy: ¥3,000 per head (despite the gender)

Number to be subsidized: to be adjusted (The decision is made by lot. Notification will be sent to the winner by Nagano Animal Protect Association.)

Requirements: A dog/cat owner who has registered the address in Hakuba (One dog/cat per household). The dog/cat has already been or will be given the surgery within Jan 1 - Dec 31, 2021. The surgery was/will be done at Yokosawa Animal Clinic, Omachi, Azumi Animal Clinic, Omachi, and Matsuzawa Animal Clinic, Hakuba. The dog should be registered and has received the rabies vaccine already. A dog/cat which is within 6-month-old to 5-year-old. Please apply at the Resident Division Hakuba Village Office. Deadline will be (Tue) Aug 31, 2021.

From Thursday, July 22 to Saturday, July 31, the Summer Road safety campaign will begin to prevent traffic accidents involving children and the elderly.

In order to protect people in traffic, especially children, who are more likely to go out during the summer vacations due to the change in their daily rhythms, and the elderly, who account for 60% of all traffic accidents, we call on all drivers to observe traffic rules and remind the right traffic manners.

- ①Preventing traffic accidents among children during summer vacation
- ②Preventing traffic accidents while walking and bicycling
- ③Encourage safe driving for the elderly.
- 4 Stop drunk driving and other malicious and dangerous driving.

Five rules for safe bicycle use

- 1. As a rule, bicycles should be used on the roadway. Sidewalks are an exception.
- 2. Use the roadway on the left.
- 3. Sidewalks are for pedestrians only. If rider have to use it, must slow down and keep left, close to the bordering the roadway.
- 4. Obey traffic safety rules.
 - ODrinking and driving, riding two persons, and riding side by side are prohibited.
 - OTurn on lights at night.
 - Obey traffic signals, stop, and check for safety at intersections.
- 5. Children must wear helmets.

Periodontal disease, such as gum disease, is the most common cause of tooth loss in middle-aged and older adults. In the early stages of the disease, there are few symptoms, and by the time the symptoms are noticed, the disease has progressed to a very advanced stage, often making it difficult to keep the teeth.

Hakuba Village provides periodontal disease examinations and health guidance, including medical interviews, general oral examinations, periodontal tissue examinations, and oral hygiene guidance, to people aged **40, 50, 60, and 70 years old** at dental institutions in the North Alps Regional District, with the aim of promoting early detection of periodontal diseases and improving awareness of oral health.

A ticket will be sent to those who are eligible, so please make an appointment the dental clinic by phone. The ticket is valid until Monday, February 28, 2022.

National Health Insurance Tax

In Japan, it is compulsory for everyone to have some form of medical insurance so that they can visit a medical institution in case of emergency. The National Health Insurance is a mutual aid system in which all members pay together to reduce the burden of medical expenses when they

visit a medical institution.

The head of the household is responsible for paying the National Health Insurance tax. Even if the head of the household is enrolled in social insurance, the head of the household is obliged to pay the tax if there is a person insured by National Health Insurance in the household.

If the total income of all National Health Insurance subscribers in the household in the previous year is below a certain level, the amount of equalization subscribers and the amount of equalization households will be reduced. However, if there is a family member whose income is unknown due to reasons such as not having filed a tax return, the reduction will not be applied because it cannot be determined whether the person meets the standard.

The total household income is the gross income of all insured persons. Even if the head of the household is not enrolled in the National Health Insurance, it is included in the income for the reduction judgment.
